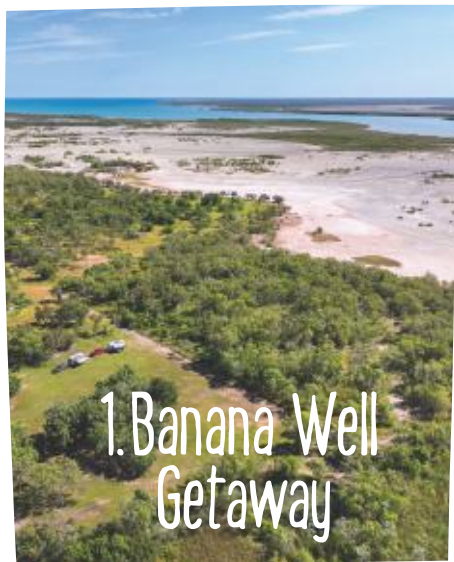
Aboriginal owned and operated

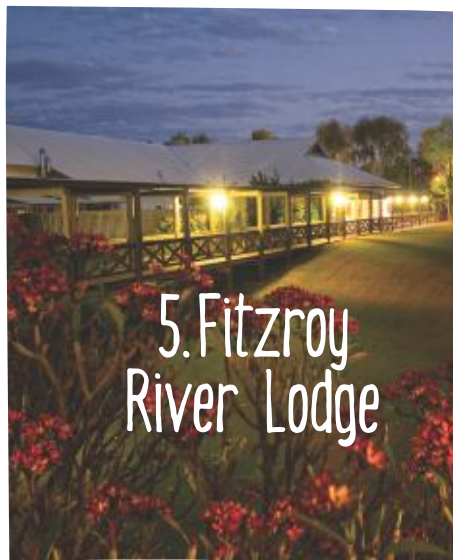

9. Mercedes Cove

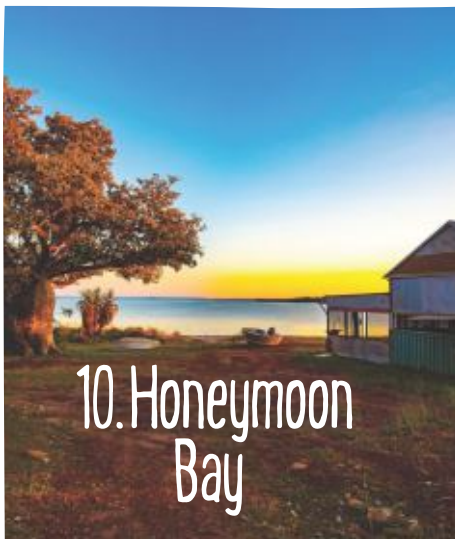

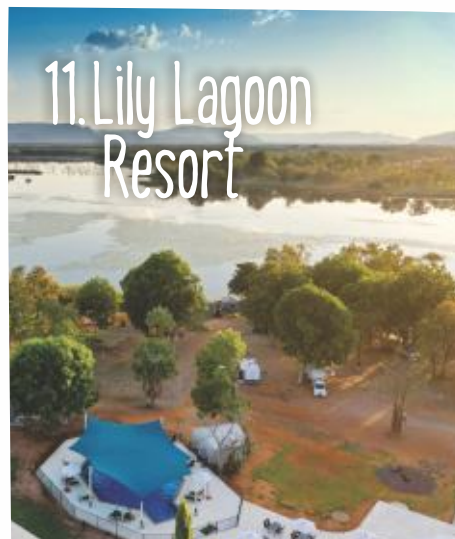


10. Honeymoon Bay

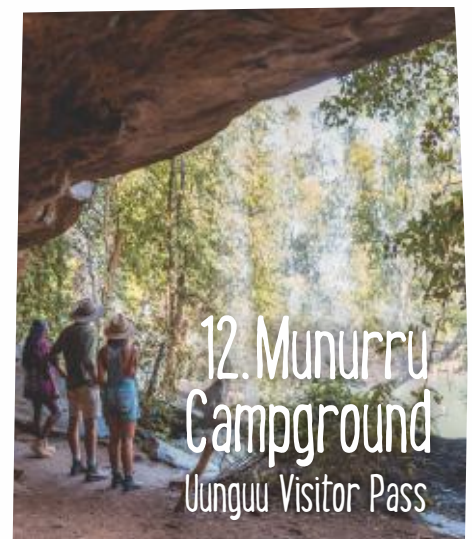


11. Lily Lagoon Resort

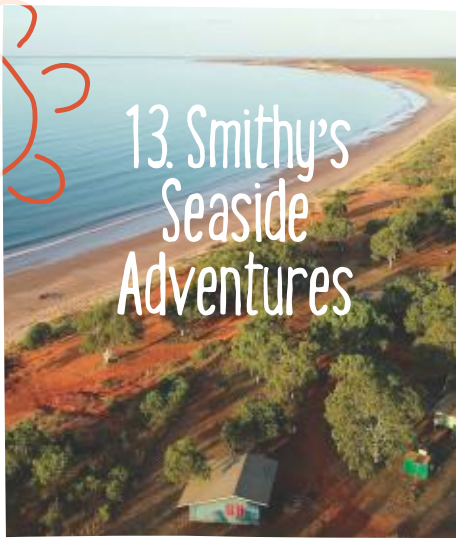


12. Munurru Campground Uunguu Visitor Pass

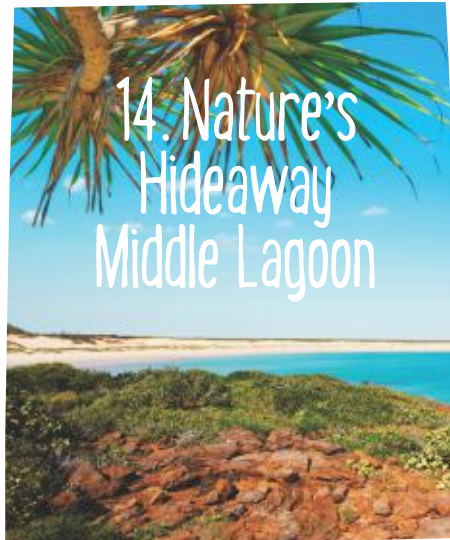

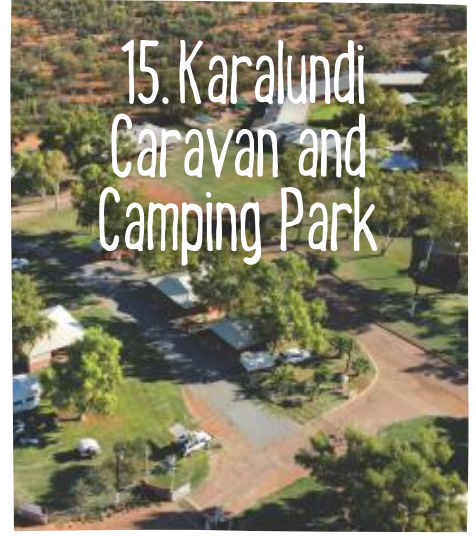

15. Karalundi Caravan and Camping Park

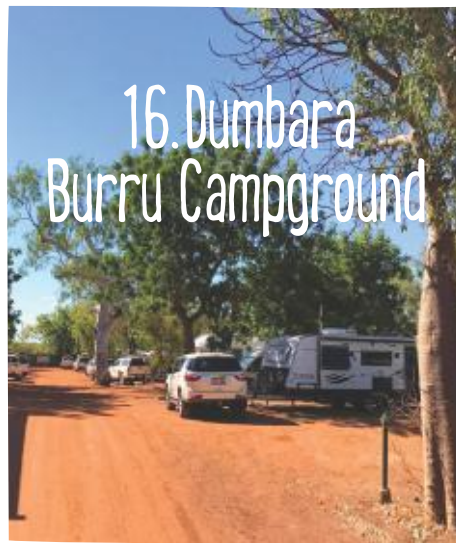

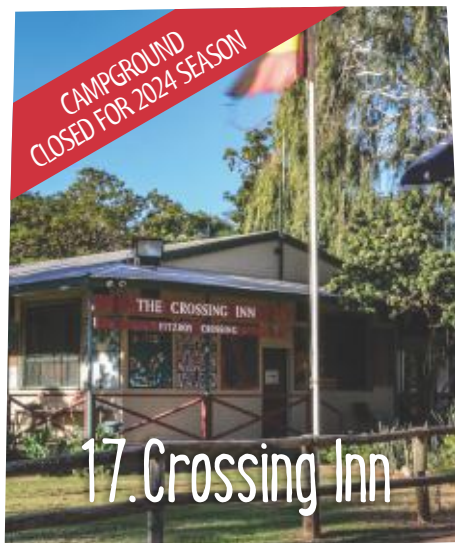

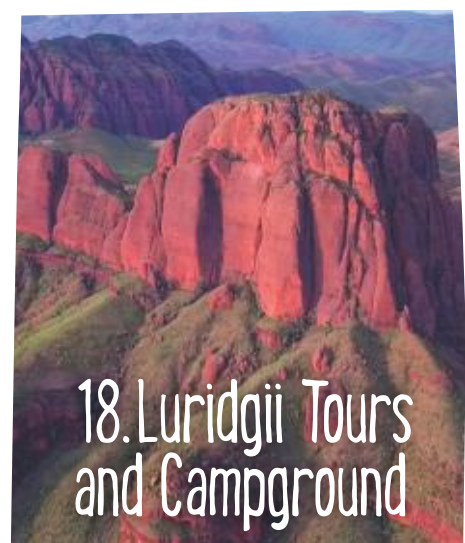

Bushfoods and medicine plants



For many tour guests, the highlight of a cultural experience is the opportunity to sample the traditional bushfoods of the region – it's such an authentic way of gaining both a glimpse and a taste of traditional cultural life. Bush tucker is a collective term used to describe the diverse range of seasonal foods traditionally used as sustenance by the First Australians. It can range from seeds, nuts, flowers and fruits through to ants, grubs, goannas, kangaroo or seafood.

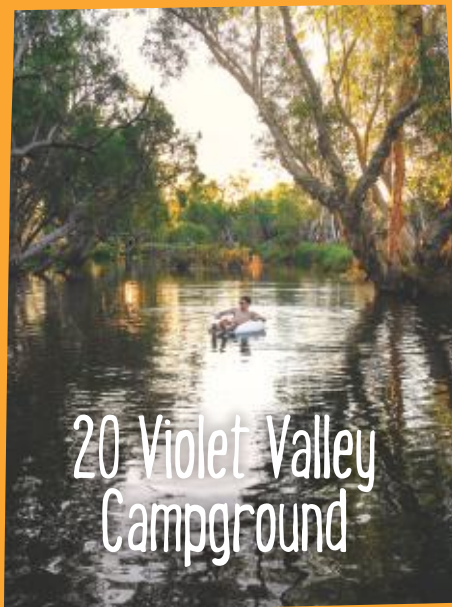

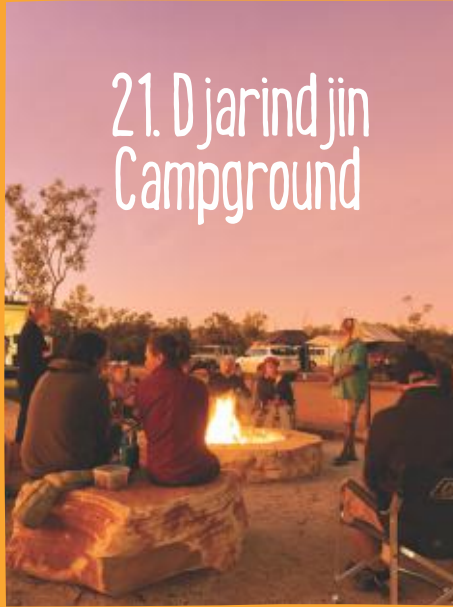


20. Violet Valley Campground
